DIRECTOR'S NOTES



What a year for Free Arts! 2023 presented so many opportunities to live the organization's values. We have bravely expanded outside of Maricopa County into Prescott and Yavapai County. We witnessed the innovative expansion of the Family Program and branded a new program, "Resilient Roots." We connected to mentors and artists and made new friends at our "Creating Compassionate Connections" conference in April. We exhibited strength and resilience through a leadership transition. And finally, we found consistent opportunities to add creativity to our collaborations with partner agencies, artists, and mentors.

In the last year, our Family Program created new relationships with foster and adoptive families through program activities for the entire family. With new staff capacity to deepen our cultural programming, we expanded our service to unaccompanied and refugee children and teens through Resilient Roots, which uses art and culture to support young people receiving care at our partner agency shelters.

Our capacity to serve Arizona continues to grow. With new staff roles deepening our cultural and clinical knowledge of resilience, our team of mentors and artists is growing in their ability to form relationships that provide hope and joy! At its heart, Free Arts uses the transforming power of the arts to foster healthy relationships for all participants. Our secret is "Art + Mentors = Resilience," and with our ongoing program evaluation, we are learning more about our outcomes and considering ways to deepen our effectiveness.

At our 30th anniversary gala in 2023, we reflected on Free Arts' journey and progress and shared our compelling vision for the future. To stay engaged with our passionate supporters, we launched a video/ audio podcast called "Canvas of the Heart" to share the amazing things that happen regularly at Free Arts. We look forward to more opportunities to tell our story and lead alongside other organizations that seek to provide resilience-building opportunities to people who need them the most.

Our past year was also one of strength in transition. We celebrated and said goodbye to two key leaders who had served the organization for many years. Stephanie Smith, VP of Operations, retired in July, and Alicia Sutton Campbell stepped down in December. The Free Arts Board of Directors selected Matt Sandoval, prior VP of Programs, as the new Executive Director.

Relationships and creativity continue to inspire Free Arts. They connect a caring group of volunteers, teaching artists, staff members, board of directors, and donors in ways that transform the lives of every participant. We are overwhelmed with gratitude for those who contribute to the mission of Free Arts.

TRANSITION

Many exciting changes are on the horizon for Free Arts! From celebrating our 30th anniversary, to expanding programming to reach more children throughout Arizona—the future of Free Arts is bright.

And now, we are pleased to announce the appointment of Matt Sandoval as our new Executive Director! Matt will take the reins from current Free Arts Executive Director Alicia Sutton Campbell after 11 transformative years of service.

"I am honored to have worked for Free Arts during this exciting time in its history – expanding services to children and families and securing a permanent home at The Bob & Renee Parsons Place for Art and Transformation," Alicia said, sharing her belief that leadership change is beneficial to keep an organization growing to meet future needs. "I look forward to seeing the next phase of growth that Matt and the talented staff will usher in."

Alicia joined Free Arts as the Director of Programs in June 2012 before becoming Executive Director in July 2014. Under her direction, Free Arts grew from 10 to 29 employees, which allowed our organization to expand services to foster care and kinship families as well as young adult program alumni. Free Arts now utilizes more than 800 volunteer mentors who work together to serve nearly 7,000 children statewide each year. We are so thankful for Alicia's leadership and unwavering dedication to our mission of transforming children's trauma to resilience through the arts.

Matt Sandoval, M.Ed., MSW has served as the Free Arts Vice President of Programs since October 2022, overseeing intentional art-based mentorship for program recipients. As Executive Director, he will work with staff and the Board of Directors to strengthen the Free Arts mission, forge new relationships with community partners, and expand our programming to reach and provide more Arizona children with a trauma-informed approach that will help them build resilience, connection, and creativity.

"The Free Arts mission and vision is a passion for me and many others that I am honored to serve alongside," Matt said. "I am excited to continue the great work of Free Arts by expanding our program statewide, creating new partnerships and developing our conference learning opportunities to impact others providing mentoring and programming in the arts."

Matt brings more than 20 years of experience to his new role at Free Arts, having worked previously in a variety of human services and non-profit organizations, including serving on several boards for groups that support youth and community development, with a special emphasis on serving multicultural, multilingual, and first-generation college attendees. We are thrilled to introduce him to you all and can't wait to see where his leadership guides the mission of Free Arts.

FREE ARTS PROGRAMS



Weekly Mentor Program

Adult volunteer mentors are matched with groups of children living in social service agencies for weekly art sessions for up to 16 weeks. Volunteer mentors use trauma-informed techniques to build relationships with their group, helping children build trusting relationships and express themselves creatively.

Professional Artist Series

Professional teaching artists lead the children through focused art-making sessions designed to develop skills and self-efficacy. Art forms include painting, drawing, cooking, dancing, drumming, and beat making. At the end of each series, children celebrate their accomplishments and demonstrate their skills to their peers at a culminating event.

Free Arts Days

Children in partner social service agencies practice self-expression with the support of volunteer mentors during this one-day program hosted in partnership with local arts and culture organizations.

Camp Series

At camp, teaching artists lead workshops designed to introduce children to new forms of self-expression while volunteer mentors support children in artistically expressing their personal stories. Intentional structure and a focus on collaboration create a safe environment and sense of community for participants. Each camp series concludes with a final performance where participants share their art and stories of resilience, hope, and healing with their community.



FREE ARTS PROGRAMS

Young Adult Empowerment Program

Formally known as the Alumni Program, YAEP helps young adults (ages 18-26) who are connected to social service agencies build skills and promote self-efficacy through expressive arts, peer mentoring, leadership, and internship opportunities. Through this program, participants are empowered to develop resilience, form healthy relationships, and gain long-lasting connections to supportive communities.

Family Program

The Free Arts Family Program was created with the intention of expanding program services to families who have experienced trauma through situations such as family violence, separation, or homelessness. With the implementation of this program, Free Arts aims to encourage harmony and resilience within the family unit by empowering parents and caregivers through education on trauma-informed care and engaging children in artistic opportunities for self-

discovery during their family transitions. Our program events are designed for the whole family including foster, kinship, and adoptive families, and cater to people of all ages.

With their participation, we hope to foster a safe and stable environment that allows family members- both parent/caregiver and child—to discover and develop their unique strengths and use them to connect with one another to create a strong and secure home environment.

Resilient Roots Program

The Free Arts Resilient Roots Program is specifically designed to serve unaccompanied refugee minors in our communities. In this program, participants are encouraged to incorporate aspects of their culture of origin such as language, values, and customs into the intentional art activities to help them build resiliency from both past traumas and new challenges that come from being in an unfamiliar environment. By honoring their stories with culturally focused art activities, they will have the chance to develop individual coping strategies that will encourage strength, promote feelings of hope, and help them maintain their unique identities.



RETURN TO FREE ARTS DAYS

After two years of being on hold, we are very excited to announce Free Arts Days are back in full swing!

From Hope & A Future's Christmas Party to helping Neighborhood Ministries celebrate their 40th Anniversary, Free Arts is making its way back into the community to support and serve children.

In December, we had the privilege of creating magical experiences with four different partners, serving over 2,150 children. With the help of Positive Network Alliance, Free Arts had the opportunity to assist children in making "Frosty hats" that expressed what makes them happy and brings them to life. At Neighborhood Ministries, children created winter wonderlands of their own inside snow globes, as well as bravery beads that allowed them to express their feelings with different colored beads.

We also partnered with Ballet Arizona's Angel Night to bring some preproduction fun to their event. Children not only watched the beautiful performance of the Nutcracker but also had the chance to create a "wishing ornament" that expressed what they truly wanted for the holidays. Free Arts is excited about the future of Free Arts Days because they give children opportunities to make intentional art and connect them with cultural art partners such as Ballet Arizona, Musical Instrument Museum, and so many more.









CAMP SERIES

The Free Arts Camp Series in 2023 kicked off June 5th, beginning with Theater Camp, and concluded with two Multicultural Arts Camps: MAC 1 and MAC 2.

THEATER CAMP came to fruition in 2001 when Free Arts partnered with the Herberger Theater Center in Phoenix to create a program that would provide the opportunity for teens in our programs to practice theater skills while creating an outlet to explore the stories from their lives that can often be difficult to share.

In its early years, Theater Camp served 20 teens and utilized just two teaching artists. Today, the program is double the size and supported by a growing number of teaching artists. Nearly 500 teens have participated in Theater Camp and more than 5,000 audience members have attended their final performances throughout the years.

Currently, Theater Camp incorporates a team that includes a camp director, along with a group of professional teaching artists, who present multiple performance art forms such as music, movement, spoken word poetry, and theater acts. These professional teaching artists, along with the rest of the Theater Camp team, facilitate workshops that empower teens to artistically express their personal stories.

This year, seventeen participants from across the Valley were introduced to and practiced the different art forms in their first week of camp at the newly renovated Phoenix Center for the Arts, and in the second week, utilized these new skills to collaborate with their peers in staging personal stories from their lives. The final performancefeatured a tapestry of



stories that included feelings of pain, solitude, anger, and love and were woven together in a beautifully staged production called "Rise to Resilience!" at the Herberger Theater Center on June 19th. The "Rise to Resilience!" theme reflects community connection and the participants' journey of resilience.

Following Theater Camp, our MAC (MULTI-CULTURAL ARTS CAMPS) series started
June 26th at a partner site, Sunshine Residential
Homes. This first MAC, affectionally deemed "MAC-Sunshine," spanned five days and served 37 teens
living in foster care group homes, and utilized
teaching artists, camp counselors, Free Arts staff,
and volunteer mentors. At the end of the camp, teens
were able to showcase all that they learned and
created to staff and loved ones at a share-out and
showcase, which was later followed by a celebration.

THE SECOND MAC took place at Free Arts' offices, located at the Bob & Renee Parsons Place for Art and Transformation. From July 11th-14th, Free Arts served 38 teens utilizing our beautiful office space as Camp classrooms for the very first time.

Teens of both Multicultural Arts Camps experienced various art forms, including movement, beat-making, buckets of fun drumming, and visual arts. More than 100 guests joined our participants for the culminating share-out and showcase celebrations, where teens shared their colorful hot air balloon visual art projects, creative beat-making, bucket drumming, and expressive Bollywood-style movements.

This was a monumental year in our Camp Series with Free Arts hosting the second MAC at our beautiful Parsons Place building, as well as being able to offer both Theater and MAC camps for the first time since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. The impact of these programs was immense: Participants experienced a sense of empowerment by using the stories that may have once hindered them to express themselves artistically. The intentional structure and focus on collaboration fostered a safe environment and a sense of community for the participants.

—— MAGIC IN MOVEMENT: —— THE YEAR OF TWO STORYBOOK BALLETS

For the last 22 years, Free Arts has partnered with Dance Theater West (DTW) to create Storybook Ballet, an annual dance program featuring Free Arts' children and teens.

And in FY 2023, Free Arts and DTW continued this amazing program—twice! Each Storybook Ballet included multiple Professional Artist Series workshops for Free Arts participants, who had the opportunity to not only display artworks created in the workshops but also to perform at the Scottsdale Center for the Performing Arts.

from Swan Lake, such as movement, and dark versus light. The photographs were displayed in the atrium for the audience members to enjoy.

Professional teaching artist Frankie Marchi led a workshop where the participants wrote poems with themes of hope, magic, and the transformation from dark to light. After writing their poems, participants recorded their works to be played at the end of the ballet performances, while DTW and Free Arts' dancers improvised movements to the spoken word. Several audience members expressed how

In the weeks leading up to Alice in Wonderland in 2022, Free Arts professional teaching artist Diana Calderon led participants from a Free Arts partner agency through a workshop in which they created accordion book autobiographies. Free Arts professional teaching artist Shelly Love led participants from another partner agency through a photography and painting series, where they created and illustrated stories. Participants also wrote poems in a spoken word Professional Artist Series led by Tomas Stanton. Those poems were recorded and played in the theater after the ballet portion of the show.

Before the Swan Lake, with a Splash! performance in 2023, Shelly Love led a Professional Artist Series for teens who have faced adversity and were residing at a Free Arts partner agency. The series consisted of photographs that shared images of self-empowerment and explored underlying themes

moved they were by the poems and the teens were happy to hear how their words impacted them.

After each performance, a Free Arts Day, which included various trauma-informed art activities, awaited participants and attendees in the lobby. One of the available projects after the Alice in Wonderland program included Painting The Roses My Way, which allowed participants to color white fabric roses using colors that they felt best described themselves. Following the Swan Lake program, art activities included folding origami swans, stringing colorful beaded Bravery Bracelets, and weaving macramé feathers.

Free Arts' volunteer mentors and staff supported participants with their creations. The children and teens were excited to celebrate with the professional teaching artists who led the workshops and to see their art displayed in the theater.

We are so grateful to Dance Theater West, the Scottsdale Center for the Performing Arts, our professional teaching artists, and our volunteer mentors for supporting our Storybook Ballet programs.

BRINGING A FREE ARTS MURAL BACK TO LIFE

Back in 2016, Free Arts ran two Professional Artist Series with teens at one of our longtime partner agencies. Teaching artist Linda Pullinsi led a series called "Trees Like Me" where each of the seven participants painted a canvas with a tree and other words or objects that represented their identities.

Kris Kollasch, another Free Arts teaching artist, came in after that series to help the teens turn their paintings into a collaborative mural called "True Colors." This mural was comprised of five large panels and weaved together each individual creation or concept into one cohesive and connected piece. The description of "True Colors" states, "It represents and expressed the teens' journey from pain and hurt, through hope, into a future that is wonderful and bright. "

These panels were installed on the side of Flo's on 7th, Florence Crittenton's thrift store in downtown Phoenix. Although the thrift store closed in 2020, Kris kept a watchful eye on the mural to ensure that it could be protected and preserved. Logistical challenges in the past couple of years delayed the project, but Kris remained persistent in advocating for preserving this piece of Free Arts history and culture.

Kris and her assistant, Sarah Roth (another Free Arts teaching artist), removed the panels in December 2022 and then went through the process of cleaning and refurbishing them. They also recreated one panel that had been lost to a storm.

The mural will now be re-installed in a new location (to be announced shortly), where it will continue to tell a story and be enjoyed by others.

Due to the passionate commitment of our longtime teaching artists, we are reminded again that art, too, can be resilient – and that it is important to protect the creativity of Free Arts participants, preserving their work, their stories, and our history.



— A YEAR OF GROWTH IN MENTORING –

This fiscal year was one of great growth for the Free Arts volunteer mentor program. Last year, we had returned to volunteer mentor training, and this year we saw an increase in the number of volunteer mentors onboarded. The program also added another staff position to better serve our volunteer mentors and our partner agencies, so we now have a volunteer coordinator and a volunteer manager.

The volunteer mentor team has developed a more targeted recruitment program, which includes recruiting volunteers from Yavapai, Pima, and Pinal counties to help support Free Arts as we move forward with our state-wide expansion. Our efforts have led to a more efficient onboarding process for the volunteer mentors, resulting in an increase in the number of volunteer mentors available to serve in our Weekly Mentor Programs throughout the Valley, as well as providing growing support for all our other programs.

Our volunteer mentor training continues to be an interactive and creative day of learning for our new volunteer mentors. They learn about adverse childhood experiences and how these experiences affect our participants. Free Arts provides role-specific training to help prepare our volunteer mentors for their roles as caring and resilience-building adults in our trauma-informed art programs. We also support the ongoing development of their skills.

We continue to integrate the latest research and best practices about trauma-informed care into our training, which is currently being revamped. Part of this revamp includes working on an update to our training manual and adding a supporting visual component, which will integrate the most current information about diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility from a study done by Volunteers Reimagined for Free Arts, as well as a new visual component. This has been an organization-wide project that we look forward to rolling out in FY24.

As our volunteer mentors participate in our Free Arts Days and Weekly Mentor programs, they develop and grow connections with other caring peers and staff, who share our mission to build resilience through the arts for our participants and fellow volunteer mentors.

Corporate volunteers and community groups provide support in a variety of programs, including participating in Free Arts Days, checking affirmation cards, and helping us assemble 3,000 Bravery Bags for children and teens who were unable to receive our direct services as we continue to reemerge from COVID-19.

Our community group volunteers, corporate volunteers, and volunteer mentors provide incredible support to Free Arts and help us further our mission. We are thankful to all of them for their interest and passion in helping our participants.

Creating Compassionate Connections

On April 29th, Free Arts held its Art + Mentors = Resilience Conference in person for the first time in three years! We are grateful for our conference sponsor, BHHS Legacy Foundation, which helped to make the conference possible. The conference's theme was "Creating Compassionate Connections," and its activities sought to demonstrate and deepen knowledge about how transformative art and mentorship support children and teens who have experienced abuse, neglect, and/or homelessness. The theme of creating compassionate connections illustrated excellent examples of ways that we know we can build hope in a young person's life. As the conference showed, combining creativity, compassion, and connections is magic!

A few of our professional teaching artists graciously hosted our interactive activities. The day started with "Buckets of Fun" presented by Mario Barela, and the activity lived up to its name. Very quickly, all the volunteer mentors, partner agency staff, and Free Arts staff were actively participating with joy. Throughout the day, attendees engaged in movement and dance with Danica Koestner, and in reflection and journaling with Sean Medlin.

During two rounds of breakout sessions, attendees had the opportunity to dig deeper into topics



related to working with families, Native American youth, mindfulness, and compassion fatigue.

The feedback from those who attended the conference highlighted the joys of creative expression, invigorated feelings regarding the power of mentorship, and showcased new connections, along with strengthening those between Free Arts staff and its partner agencies.

Then, in an afternoon session, we announced the all-new Free Arts podcast, Canvas of the Heart, which began airing in June 2023! Matt Sandoval, then Free Arts VP of Programs and incoming Executive Director, as well as Jenna Christie-Tabron, Free Arts Program Clinical Director, host the podcast, which highlights the work of Free Arts through guest interviews and topical discussions. The podcast is available on many popular streaming platforms.

In the future, Free Arts plans to expand the conference offerings to include even more cultural partners and agencies that promote resilience for children and young adults. So, rest assured, fans of the conference, Free Arts will continue to create learning and connecting experiences for mentors and partner agencies.





FINGERPRINT CARD APPLICATION

Our partner agencies require volunteers to have a fingerprint clearance card provided from the state. If you don't already have one—don't worry! We will help you through the steps to apply for the card. The cost is approximately \$75.*
